Caring Corner

We're starting out 2022 with a month spent praying together: privately, as a family, and as a congregation. The theme for January will be "31 Days, 31 Ways, 2 Pray 4 Families," from author Catherine P. Downing. She writes from her strong base of Christian faith and a mother whose son has a chronic and serious mental illness.

Her introduction to this exercise explains it best:
"Families who walk alongside their loved ones in the labyrinths of mental illnesses are often hesitant to ask for prayer. They might feel others will judge them or their loved one, offer uninformed advice or initiate the gossip chain. But friends who observe or are aware of their journey don't necessarily need specific details to pray effectively."

Please join us in a daily prayer you will find on the Light of Christ Facebook posts, on our website or in a special personal email. There are printed copies of the entire month of prayers in the Narthex for you to take home, as you desire. This theme will also be featured in our Sunday services.

If you or someone you love lives through the ups and downs of mental illness, we pray for healing and peace that comes from nurturing and being rooted in our faith and trust in our God.

Catherine Downing wrote a blog on sparksofredemp-tivegrace.com called *Mental Illness, Prayer and Extravagant Grace* in which she shares her four personal prayer principles. We will highlight one each week of the month.

Week #2:

Because "each day has enough trouble of its own" (Matthew 6:34b), I pray every single day for God's favor and grace. Every morning I thank God in anticipation of his presence being with us every single moment - no matter how the day unfolds. At the close of the day, I give thanks for the ways I have seen his goodness and mercy follow us on that particular day (Psalm 23:6). And of course, throughout the day are the ongoing conversations with our Father in heaven who knows our son best and loves him most.

Prayer, I have discovered, is a discipline of unceasing watchfulness.

Psalm 121: 1-2: "I lift up mine eyes to the hills and I wonder, from whence comes my help? My help comes from the Lord who made the heavens and the earth! He will not let you stumble and fall...indeed he who watches over his people never tires nor sleeps."

The Holy Spirit—Then and Now – The Holy Spirit is probably the least understood person of the Holy Trinity. Yet the Holy Spirit is a vital, vibrant presence in our lives. So, how do we learn to be more aware. more awake, and more in tune to the presence of the Spirit within us and around us and between us? One way is to study the Book of Acts. The full title of Acts is The Acts of the Apostles, but it could also be titled *The Acts of the Holy Spirit*. In Acts, we see the Holy Spirit at work transforming lives, communities, and situations.

Pastor Bruce will be leading a four-week series on the Book of Acts. We will meet on February 6, 13, 20, 27 at 10:15 AM in the new Living Room (old Youth Room). We will be using the Bible Project

Word for the Week From the from Pastor Bruce **Beauty**



One of the goals we set for ourselves in our New Day for God's Beloved campaign was to strengthen our worship and music ministry. And one way we do that is to make our services as beautiful as possible. The more beautiful a worship service the better. We are constantly striving to create worship services that are filled with beautiful music, beautiful banners and paraments, beautiful flowers, beautiful words, and beautiful images. Striving for beauty in worship is something that hasn't changed because of the pandemic.

One great addition in this vein are the banners and paraments in our chancel. They are breathtakingly beautiful. What you may not know is that they were conceived and made by one of our own, Maxine Johnson. Thank you, Maxine!

Why is beauty in worship so important? Because beauty draws us closer to Christ. He is the Author of all beauty. Everything beautiful comes from him, and therefore, everything beautiful also draws us closer to him—every beautiful sunrise and sunset; every beautiful mountain and lake; every beautiful piece of music; every beautiful image; every beautiful child. All these things and more bring us closer to Christ.

Fyodor Dostoyevsky was one of the great Russian novelists. He wrote a novel titled *T*he Idiot. The protagonist in the novel is a man named Myshkin. He is seen, by nearly everyone, as a simpleton, a fool, an idiot. But in fact, he is the wisest person of all. He is, in the words of St. Paul in the first chapter of 1 Corinthians, a "fool for Christ." And at one point in the novel, he says that "beauty will save the world."

I believe that Dostoyevsky went a bit too far with that statement. Beauty itself will not save us. But it will lead us to the One who does save us: to Jesus Christ, for he is a beautiful Savior—beautiful in love, beautiful in power, and beautiful in grace.

So please pray that the Holy Spirit will grace us so that we can create beauty, and rejoice in beauty, so that in our worship we can be drawn ever deeper into the miracle and the mystery of God's everlasting love for you, for me, and for all.

"No one likes a bragger." "Don't blow your own horn." (Uff da, I hear my mother's voice!)


