## CHURCH NEWS

May 24, 2021

Dear Sisters and Brothers at Light of Christ,

On behalf of the Church Council, I'm writing to let you know that at our May meeting last Tuesday, we made the following decisions regarding our worship life as we move into the summer season.

• First, we will continue to follow the recommendations of the CDC and MN Department of Health.



#### Online

Second, we will continue to post an online, YouTube service each Sunday through the summer.

#### Indoors

- Third, we will hold an **indoor service in the sanctuary on Sunday mornings at 9:00 AM beginning on May 30<sup>th</sup>.** In keeping with the latest recommendations of the MN Department of Health (5/18), we will do the following things:
  - 1) **Social distancing**. Families/pods will be seated at a six-foot distance from one another. This social distancing requirement limits us to a maximum of 72 people per service. Therefore, we will have a SignUp Genius for each service and we'll ask you to sign up **by the Friday before each Sunday service**. This will give us adequate time to put together a seating chart for each service.
  - 2) Masking. For those who are fully vaccinated, masks are optional. For those who are not fully vaccinated, masks are required except for children five and under. Because children under the age of 12 cannot get vaccinated at this time, and many teenagers are not yet fully vaccinated, we will be requiring everyone to mask up when we are singing as a congregation.
  - 3) Holy Communion. We will celebrate Holy Communion "in place/in the pews."

#### **Outdoors**

- We will also hold an outdoor service on the church lawn on Wednesday evenings at 6:30 PM beginning on June 2<sup>nd</sup>, weather permitting. Because we have so many children and youth who are not fully vaccinated yet, or can't get vaccinated until the fall, we will be designing this service to be as "kid/youth friendly" as possible and still be a "low risk" service.
  - 1) Social distancing. Social distancing is encouraged in order to keep our kids as safe as possible.
  - Masking. Masking is optional for everyone.
  - 3) Holy Communion. We will celebrate Holy Communion "in place."

## Going Forward

 Fifth, as you well know, emerging from the pandemic is a fluid situation and we fully expect the guidance from the CDC and MN Department of Health to change as we move through the summer and into the fall. So at our monthly Council meetings we will review our policies and practices in relation to COVID19 and make the necessary revisions that will allow us to be as open as possible and also as" low-risk" as possible.

Please don't hesitate to contact anyone on the Council with your comments, or concerns, or questions. We look forward to speaking with you.

Holy Trinity is located just east of the Minneapolis 3<sup>rd</sup> Police Precinct, and its neighborhood was where protests sprang up in the hours and days following George Floyd's death. Since that time the Church has seen an increase in the amount of people needing assistance. Pastor Ingrid Arneson Rasmussen has said they are most in need of donations to their Justice Fund to continue its work in the neighborhood. # Caring Corner

#### **Understanding Bipolar Mental Illness**

The month of May is Mental Health Awareness Month. The Caring Corner is reaching out to our congregation to provide information and support during this time to those who have a mental health illness and for family and friends who provide support to those individuals. This article provides information about bipolar disorders.

There are different types of bipolar disorders. In the past these illnesses were termed manic depression. During the depressive periods people usually sleep too much, have little energy and have very sad thoughts. While this condition is likely going to continue through a lifetime, medications, therapy, support groups, exercise, healthy eating and drinking, and reaching out to those around you can all help to make life better and quite functional. Julie Wischmann provided excellent mindfulness ideas in her May 17<sup>th</sup> LOC Caring Corner as well.

A question frequently asked is "how can I help someone who is living with bipolar mental illness?" It is most helpful for you to get educated about the illness and don't assume you know what they are going through. Encourage them to seek professional help as described above and be supportive of their treatment plan. Listen to them and do not judge or try to "fix" their illness. You may not always approve of their actions/ words, but reach out and let them know you are available to talk and listen. Coach them to maintain a schedule. Invite them somewhere outside of their house if they wish, continue inviting but also understand if they request time alone. You could offer to go to a support group with them, reassure them that their lives have meaning and that their illness does not define or limit them. And if you are a care giver, also take care of yourself and consider seeking out a support group to connect with others.

The special messages we are spreading this month and beyond is that mental illness is not a choice but an illness. Please join us in spreading these messages, "Walk a Mile in My Shoes," "Break the Stigma," "I Cannot Do It Alone," "You Are not Alone, I'm with You," "You Are a Beloved Child of God," and "God Is There for You." And as Psalm 139 says, "I am fearfully and wonderfully made."

A special thank you for all who supported our LOC walk to spread these messages!! Let's keep walking!!


# Free Items!



# **VBS Is Coming Soon!**

Spring is here and summer will follow soon enough! *Parents of current preschoolers-4<sup>th</sup> graders:* look at your calendar and set aside the 3<sup>rd</sup> week of July for Light of Christ's Vacation Bible School! Although VBS had to be done virtually last summer and will be running a little differently this summer as well, LOC is excited to welcome back the children in-person. We hope you will keep LOC in mind as you make your summer plans. More details about each program and access to registration links are given below:

**LOC's Preschool VBS** is for children who turn 3-years-old by July 20<sup>th</sup> up to those entering kindergarten in the fall of 2021. The theme for this camp is "Through Life's Ups and Downs, Jesus' Power Pulls Us Through". It is taken from the Rocky Railway VBS program that LOC was supposed to do last summer but was unable to due to the pandemic. This program will run daily

from 4:00 pm-5:00 pm Tuesday, July 20<sup>th</sup>-Thursday, July 22<sup>nd</sup> and will be led by Kirsten Kelly. More details can be found and registration may be completed at **LOC Preschool VBS**. There are currently 16 children enrolled.

<u>LOC's VBS led by Shetek Lutheran Ministries</u> is for children who will be entering grades 1<sup>st</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> in the fall of 2021 and will be led by Shetek Lutheran Ministries. The theme for this camp is "Dwell Faithfully" based upon the bible verse *As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love*-John 15:9. This program will run daily from 9:00 am-2:30 pm Monday, July 19<sup>th</sup>-Thursday, July 22<sup>nd</sup>. More details can be found at <u>LOC VBS led by Shetek Lutheran Ministries</u>. There are currently 21 children enrolled for this program.
