

Are We Asking Too Much of Our Teens? Part 2

How can we help our teens?

Recognizing the unique challenges faced by our teens regarding stress, it is crucial for us as parents, educators, and community members to provide them with the support and guidance they need. This includes:

- **Open Communication:** Encourage open and honest conversations with our teens, allowing them to express their feelings, concerns, and challenges.
- **Realistic Expectations:** Set realistic expectations for our teens' academic and extracurricular pursuits, recognizing that they are still developing and learning.
- **Unconditional Support:** Offer unconditional love, support, and acceptance, regardless of their achievements or failures.
- **Time for Relaxation and Connection:** Ensure that our teens have adequate time for relaxation, hobbies, and spending quality time with family and friends.
- **Teach Coping Skills:** Provide our teens with coping mechanisms to manage stress, such as mindfulness, deep breathing exercises, and seeking professional help when needed.
- Advocate for Change: Advocate for changes in educational and extracurricular systems that prioritize well-being and holistic development of our teens.
- Religious Community: Teens who are involved in a religious community may find that their faith provides them with a sense of belonging, purpose, and support. Religious communities can offer teens opportunities to connect with other teens who share their beliefs, as well as access to religious leaders and other adults who can provide guidance and support.

By understanding the pressures faced by our teens and taking steps to support and guide them, we can create a more nurturing and supportive environment that allows them to thrive and reach their full potential. Consider praying for our youth; that God will guide them in choosing priorities and help them to cope, and their parents recognize early signs of stress and mental illness and find them support.


