The senior center also relies on volunteers to serve lunch, wash dishes, and help with various activities. Please call <u>763-972-0574</u> to learn more about volunteering.



# SUNDAY MORNING ADULT EDUCATION



She writes about the experience of her family but also includes surveys of pastors as well as the latest clinical research. She reminds us that people with a mental illness are our neighbors and our sisters and brothers in Christ, and thus, we cannot do what the culture often does, which is to reduce them to caricatures and ghosts, or worse yet, pretend that don't exist. Amy calls us to love everyone and she provides practical strategies and recommendations for living Christ's love for all in our personal lives and in our congregation.

We will also be discussing this book in our Adult Education class on Sunday mornings at 9:30 AM. This book discussion is a part of our strategic initiative to be a community of hope and healing for all who suffer because of a mental illness.
