# Word for the Week from Pastor Bruce Lord

Jesus doesn't want what is mine. He doesn't want it. He doesn't need it. He wants something else, something far more important. He wants me.

The story of the rich young ruler makes that clear. Here was a pious, upstanding, spiritual young man. He came to Jesus seeking spiritual wisdom. Jesus looked at him and loved him. And Jesus could see that there was one thing keeping this young man from following him – his money.

So, Jesus told him to go, sell everything he owned, give the money to the poor, and then come and follow him. But when the young man heard this, his face fell, and he walked away from Jesus filled with great sorrow, because he had great wealth. (Mark 10:17-22)

He loved his wealth more than he loved God. His possessions had first place in his heart and in his life. He put them before God. So, that was the one thing Jesus asked him to surrender. That's what the Lord always does.

Jesus always asks me to give him the thing I love more than him. I may say: Lord, you can have everything else. But this one thing I want to keep for myself, to have as my own, to keep under my control. When I do that, he always asks for that one thing. It may be my money, like it was for this rich, young ruler. But it could be something else entirely. It can be almost anything.

No matter what it is, that is the one thing Jesus asks me to give because he wants all of me, not just most of me, or some of me. He wants all of me, because if he doesn't have all of me, he really doesn't have me at all. If there is something else that is more important, more influential than him, something I love more than I love him, then he is really not Lord of my life.

Jesus wants to be my Lord and yours because he is the Lord of Love. He wants to give us his love in all its fullness and richness and doesn't want anything to stand in the way. He doesn't anything to diminish his love. He wants us to live in his love, and rejoice in his love, and give his love away. He wants to be our first and best love, for time and for eternity.

# Caring Corner

#### Co-Occurring Substance Use Disorder & Mental Illness

The Healing and Wholeness Committee at Light of Christ hopes to continue offering support, resources, prayer and encouragement to those experiencing mental illness. We hope our Caring Corner can provide that.

A very difficult challenge in life for some people is co-occurring substance abuse along with mental illness. A substance use disorder (SUD) is a mental disorder that affects a person's brain and behavior leading to a person's inability to control their use of substances such as legal or illegal drugs and/or alcohol. According to the National Institute of Mental Health, research has shown that half of those experiencing SUD will also experience in their life time a co-occurring mental health disorders such as depression, anxiety, PTSD, bipolar disorder, personality disorder and others. Although current research shows one does not necessarily cause the other. It suggests three possibilities where they may occur together. Common risk factors:

- They can both run in families thus genes may be a factor. Environmental factors such as stress or trauma can cause genetic changes that can be passed down through generations.
- Mental health disorders can contribute to SUD: studies have found that people with mental health disorders such as those listed above may use drugs or alcohol for self-medication.
   Also, some experience brain changes and they get rewarding effects from substances and thus continue to abuse.
- Substance abuse can contribute to mental health disorders over time triggering changes in brain structure and function that can make a person more likely to develop a mental health disorder.

If ignored and no treatment is received, the condition is likely to get worse. It is recommended that it is better to treat these two together rather than separately to assure therapies and medications are tailored to an individual's specific combination of needs. Research has found that there are several excellent therapies and medications now that can help the person regain their life. This co-occurring diagnosis can also be very difficult for family and friends of the person as well. There are excellent resources and services such as the websites NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness) and My Quiet Cave (a spiritual and wellness website) that can help provide support for the person struggling as well as loved ones during and after the recovery process. The LOC website has several links for help during this difficult time under the Support link. The LOC library also has several excellent books on this topic.

LOC members, we are there for you and want to support you in this journey. You are not alone. Things can be done to conquer this to get on the road to recovery and reclaim lives back. There is always HOPE! YOU ARE GOD'S BELOVED. As Jeremiah 17:14 says, Heal me Lord and I will be healed; save me and I will be saved for you are the one I praise.
