The Community Life committee invites you to join them for fellowship as they gather together to pack life-saving meals at Feed My Starving Children on **Tues-**

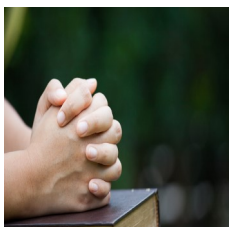

Your Healing and Wholeness

Committee is *excited* to invite you all to a special event on **Saturday, November 13th at 10:00 am.** We will be hosting a NAMI Minnesota program called "In Our Own Voice" to help bring awareness to mental illness, break the stigma associated with having mental illness, and share the good news that once correctly diagnosed, a person with a mental disorder can manage his or her symptoms with therapy, medication and support.

NAMI Minnesota has asked two volunteers to speak about their journeys living with mental illness and achieving recovery. The presentation includes personal stories and video clips as well as an opportunity to ask questions.

This 90-minute program is open to the public and we encourage you to invite your families, friends, neighbors, and coworkers. Flyers have been posted in Delano and surrounding area churches and places of business.

You can attend in-person in the sanctuary wearing masks. (Speakers will not wear masks during their presentation so everyone can hear their message.) As an alternative, the event will be livestreamed on our Light of Christ [Facebook page](#). Word for the Week from Pastor Bruce *Surprises*

I believe that you and I may be surprised at the people we meet in heaven. We may see some people we least expect to see.

Not long ago I ran across a poem that captures the heavenly surprises that await us. It's called *Heaven's Surprise* by Ludwig Taylor.

*I was shocked, confused, bewildered as I entered Heaven's door,
Not by the beauty of it all, nor the lights or its decor.*

*But it was the folks in Heaven who made me sputter and gasp—
The thieves, the liars, the sinners, the alcoholics and the trash.*

*There stood the kid from seventh grade who swiped my lunch money twice.
Next to him was my old neighbor who never said anything nice.*

*Herb, who I always thought was rotting away in hell,
Was sitting pretty on cloud nine, looking incredibly well.*

*I nudged Jesus, 'What's the deal? I would love to hear your take.
How'd all these sinners get up here? God must've made a mistake.*

'And why's everyone so quiet, so somber – give me a clue.'
'Child,' He said, 'they're all in shock. They never thought they'd be seeing you!'

A temptation we constantly face is to limit the reach of Christ's love: to believe that there are some people who are simply beyond the pale of his love. Because of what they have done, or not done, they cannot possibly be loved, or saved, by our Lord. But retired Archbishop Desmond Tutu reminds us that this conviction is simply untrue. He once said: "We may be surprised at the people we find in heaven. God has a soft spot for sinners. His standards are quite low."

That's good news for all of us. For we are all saved by grace. Our eternal salvation is a gift. Christ came for all; he lives for all; and he is seeking to save us all—no exceptions. He wants us all to belong to his beloved community. He wants to make us all a part of one human family.

And given that he is the God of all love, that shouldn't come as a surprise after all.



Columbarium Update

On October 24, 2021 a Special Congregational Meeting was held for the purpose of holding a vote, hoping to gain congregational approval on the financing and construction of a Columbarium and Memorial Garden at Light of Christ. The Columbarium Committee is grateful to share that the vote to move forward on this project was passed – almost unanimously.

The Committee has now moved on to Phase 2, which includes working with our identified suppliers to prepare for construction to begin in the spring and beginning pre-sales of niches.

She can answer any questions you may have and can help you initiate the purchase process. The cost to acquire a niche is \$3800, and one niche can hold up to two urns. A pre-sales discount price of \$3610 is available for niches purchased through **12/31/21**.

Did you know the universal symbol for honoring a Veteran is holding your hand over your heart? When you see a member of the Military, honor them by holding your hand to your heart! Remember: November 11th is Veteran’s Day. Contact a Veteran you know and say “**THANKS!!**”

Armistice Day commemorates the signing of the end of WWI (the war to end all wars) at 11:00 a.m., November 11, 1918 (name changed to Veteran’s Day in 1954). The poppy was one of the only plants growing on the barren battlefields. On May 3, 1915, while looking at the grave of his close friend and former student, Canadian surgeon Lieutenant-Colonel John McCrae composed the poem, *In Flanders Fields*.



Verse 1

In Flanders fields the poppies blow
Between the crosses, row on row,
That mark our place; and in the sky
The larks, still bravely singing, fly
Scarce heard amid the guns below.

(The battlefield spanned southern Belgium
and northwest France)
