## Helping Delano Families

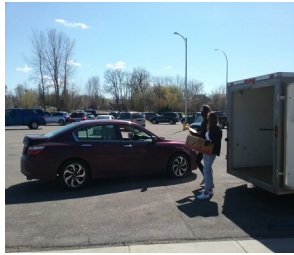
This year has been challenging for everyone in different ways, but it has been particularly difficult for those who are struggling financially. Although the Christmas season is a joyous time for many, we must remember that it can actually bring about added stress for parents who desperately want to partake in the tradition of gift-giving, but do not have the financial means to do so. After careful consideration, our Children & Family Ministry has decided to turn our focus towards local families in need. We will be teaming up with a foundation called **Friends for a Cause**, which was started by Jill VanBeusekom, a Delano resident and social worker for Wright County. The foundation's mission statement is "to celebrate that giving is greater than receiving through the connections of community and friendship." This foundation is in partnership with the Delano Area Schools' counselors. Friends for a Cause will help over 50 Delano families and also 113 foster care kids in Wright county. Our CFM team has decided to "adopt" 10 local families. A sign up will be going out in the next week or so and gifts will be due December 10<sup>th</sup>. Please keep this great service project in mind when you are thinking about ways you can give back this holiday season. Let's help spread some Christmas cheer for some of our local families in need!

## Produce Distribution Volunteers Needed

Light of Christ continues to distribute fresh produce to area residents in partnership with Our Father's Lutheran Church in Rockford through their NourishingHOPE ministry. ## Caring Corner

*If you are concerned about a loved one with mental illness, you are struggling too. Please*

*join our spiritual support group Monday, November 9<sup>th</sup> at 7pm in the church library (and the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Monday each month).*

Everyone knows what it feels like to be anxious. This past year and the election week demonstrated that!

"Anxiety is a normal cognitive and physiological response that God designed to call our attentions to the seriousness of an event or situation, and motivate us to actions. With an anxiety disorder, however, the anxiety is not mild and brief, but severe and chronic. Panic attacks, a consuming wave of fear and dread, are a common characteristic of the anxiety disorders."

"Anxiety disorders are the most common mental illness in the US, affecting approximately 40 million adults, and often first surface in childhood or early adulthood. Like all mental illnesses, anxiety disorders result from a complex interaction of psychosocial, biological and developmental factors."

King David in the Old Testament suffered from major depressive disorder and anxiety (which often accompanies depression). In Psalm 55:4-6, David describes symptoms of anxiety and a panic attack, a feeling of overwhelming dread with trembling, racing heart, and heart pain. Throughout the Psalms David vents his feelings and cries out to the Lord for help. In Biblical times there were no treatments for anxiety, but today there are effective medications and CBT (cognitive behavior therapy). Thus, it is so important to seek professional help when your anxiety is such that it affects your ability to enjoy life.

The above are excerpts and information are from "Grace for the Afflicted- A Clinical and Biblical Perspective on Mental Illness" by Matthew S. Stanford. This book is in our church library along with many others on a small cart designated as Mental Health resources, available for check-out.

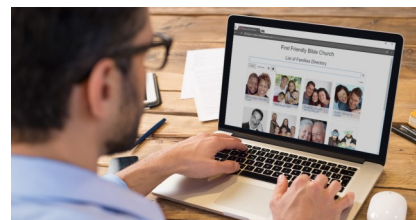
### **Choir Update!**

If you have signed up for your monthly Sunday school materials to be picked up at the church, here are the times you will be able to do that. The packets are in a box located near the entrance to the church library.

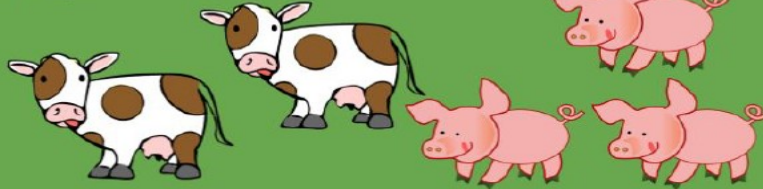
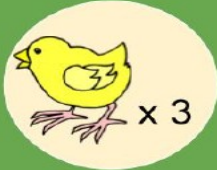

Armistice Day commemorates the signing of the end of WWI (the war to end all wars) at 11:00 a.m., November 11, 1918 (name changed to Veteran’s Day in 1954). The poppy was one of the only plants growing on the barren battlefields. On May 3, 1915, while looking at the grave of his close friend and former student, Canadian surgeon Lieutenant-Colonel John McCrae composed the poem, *In Flanders Fields*.



### Verse 1

In Flanders fields the poppies blow  
Between the crosses, row on row,  
That mark our place; and in the sky  
The larks, still bravely singing, fly  
Scarce heard amid the guns below.

(The battlefield spanned southern Belgium  
and northwest France)
