WCCA Head Start has openings at multiple centers for the 2020-2021 program year. Head Start offers a **free** comprehensive preschool program for children ages 3-5. Class days and times vary by location.

The goal of the Head Start & Early Head Start programs is to provide every family in our program the best start for their children under 5. WCCA provides services to all children, including those with any health, developmental or nutritional needs.

Dear Light of Christ Community,

I'm writing to give you a brief update on what the Church Council has been doing in light of the most recent COVID-19 developments. As you may know, we have decided that the Church Council will be making all the decisions regarding our "living with" the virus as a congregation. The Council wants to hear from our committees, staff, task forces, and congregation as we live with this virus. But we believe it is best for us as a congregation to have the Council make the final decision and not have multiple people or groups making these decisions.

Several weeks ago the Governor issued an Executive Order which allowed congregations to open up our buildings for worship services and other ministries. In response to that Order, the Minnesota Department of Health issued a document titled Industry Guidance for Safely Reopening: Faith-based Communities, Places of Worship, Weddings, and Funerals. https://mn.gov/deed/assets/worship-guidance-ACC_tcm1045-433301.pdf

In this document the Department of Health directs congregations to develop and implement a COVID-19 Preparedness Plan before opening our doors. The Health Department then lays out eight pages of policies, procedures and protocols that must be included in the Preparedness Plan.

So for the last three weeks the Council has been hard at work on developing and implementing a Light of Christ Preparedness Plan. The Council has been assisted by our staff members and by a Wellness Task Force made up of seven health care professionals in our congregation. The Task Force members are Luke Borman (Pharmacist), Kelly Harstad (Nurse), Ben Nielsen (Hospital Administrator), Britta Reierson (Physician and TF Co-Chair), Barb Russell (Occupational Therapist), Stacy VanCura (Mental Health Therapist), and Heidi Wuerger (Physician and TF Co-Chair). Kylee Amdor, our Council President, and I are also on the task force. The task force has been working through the Department of Health guidelines and advising the Council on how we can gather "in-person" for our various services and ministries in as safe and as low-risk a way as possible.

The Council has already approved some parts of our Preparedness Plan and beginning next week we will send you the policies and procedures that have been, and will be, implemented. Please don't hesitate to contact any Council member if you have any questions or concerns or comments about our Preparedness Plan.

I'm also forwarding to you an email from our Minneapolis Area Synod Bishop, Ann Svennungsen (see next page) about the wisdom of conducting in-person worship right now.

Finally, please continue to hold Light of Christ, our Delano community, and the wider nation and world in your prayers as we seek to stay as vibrant as we can despite this virus.

A message about in-person worship and COVID testing from Bishop Ann Svennungsen

"Today, Phase III of Stay Safe MN goes into effect, permitting in-person worship with 50% capacity, no more than 250 people, and strict adherence to protocols for disease prevention.

Today, with the support of the Synod Council Executive Committee, I urge you to refrain from indoor, in-person worship until the number of new cases declines to April levels.

As in every season, we live with a deep, God-given need **to be together**, to share the peace of Christ with a handshake or hug, and to gather together around table and font (and coffee pot). I praise God for that yearning. And, I know we will need to grow ever more creative in providing the spiritual encouragement and pastoral care that are needed as we respond to the pandemics of COVID-19 and systemic racism.

However, I do not believe we are ready for indoor, in-person worship.

Rather, let us make June 10 the day in which we can say that every one of our 145 congregations has formed a "Pandemic Preparedness Team," a group of diverse individuals who vigorously commit to study and keep up-to-date with accurate information from medicine and public health; a group that brings wisdom needed to guide us for that time we return to indoor, in-person worship.

I know that several congregations already have such a team in place, and that some congregations have found ways to safely gather for outdoor or drive-in worship. Yet, each congregational context is unique. And our planning will be ongoing. The ELCA has **excellent materials** to guide us.

Our synod staff is now preparing protocols to allow a maximum of 5 staff members to return to the synod office at a future date. Even those protocols are exhausting to compile. Imagine preparing for 250 people, while your leaders are still exhausted from the learning curves of preparing online worship services and building online networks for care and encouragement.

Consistently, we hear that COVID-19 spread is dependent upon three variables:

Time spent together
Distance between people
The unpredictability of the environment

When I think of in-person worship, I am especially mindful of the third variable. The habits of welcome and affection when we gather are almost impossible to resist. This was especially apparent to me while participating in the Clergy March last week.

There is much we are still learning about this virus. I urge you to watch <u>Living in a COVID-19 World</u>. Presented by the Federal Reserve Bank of Minnesota, it features ELCA member, Michael Osterholm, as well as Neel Kashkari, Sir Jeremy Farrar, Julie Gerberding, Larry Sommers, and others, and is moderated by Tom Brokaw. It addresses not only medical realities but economic issues.

I also urge everyone who participated in a march or mass gathering to protest the killing of George Floyd or in food distribution efforts in affected communities to get tested this week (or between 5 and 7 days after your participation). Testing is key to preventing the spread of COVID-19.

We are church together. And, we are doing the work of the church, even while physically distancing. We are worshiping and praying together, serving the neighbor, caring for the sick, and advocating for justice. We continue this vital work – always guided by the centrality of Jesus' call to love God and neighbor, especially the most vulnerable among us.
