
Light of Christ Church family,

Word for the Week from Pastor Bruce

Carols

I love Christmas carols. Of all the music that we sing during the church year, the Christmas carols are my favorite.

I love the melodies and the harmonies. They are so lush and beautiful. And I love them even more when they are set in great choral arrangements. I'm a choral music nerd. I love singing and hearing great choral music all through the year, but especially at Christmas. The great choral settings touch my soul deeply.

But I'm drawn even more to the words of the Christmas carols because they express one of the deepest mysteries of our faith: that in the Christ Child, the Creator became a creature, the divine became fully human, the Word became flesh.

For example, in *O Come, All Ye Faithful* we sing: "born of a virgin, a mortal he comes . . ." and "Word of the Father, now in flesh appearing . . ." In *What Child Is This* we sing: "Hail, hail, the Word made flesh, the babe, the son of Mary." In *Hark! The Herald Angels Sing* we sing: "Veiled in flesh the Godhead see! Hail incarnate deity!"

These are just a few of the lines that express the mind-bending, mind-boggling good news that the Creator of the universe—a universe that is far bigger and far older than our ancestors ever imagined—took on a human brain and body and became like us. The Creator of the galaxies, who holds the galaxies in the palm of his hand, galaxies that are millions of light years in size, became so small that he could be held within Mary's womb.

He became like we now are so that he might make us like he now is. One day, in glory, we will be like Christ. And that means, above all, that we will be able to love Christ, love others, and love ourselves as fully and freely as he has first loved us. Our love will finally be made perfect.

Is it any surprise, then, that the Christmas carols are permeated with a sense of wonder and joy? Not really. Because that's what Love Incarnate does—he surprises us and gladdens us, not just for time but for all eternity.



Passing along the 'Thank You!'

My job takes me all around the Twin Cities on a weekly basis, so I have ample opportunity to hand out our care bags to those in need. They are always received with the **UTMOST** gratitude, a smile and an occasional 10 second conversation. So, to those who helped supply and pack the bags of water, socks, lip balm, granola bars, I want to extend a sincere **Thank You** on behalf of those who have received them and said as much to me. But I am just the conduit...

In fact, now that I have your attention, I also want to share that I have had some personal struggles in handing these out. There are those who are desperate - whose voices are hoarse from dehydration and whose hands are terribly cracked from the weather - who clearly need these bags and so much more. They are the ones I try to talk to, to say a quick prayer with, to verbally remind that God loves them. These are the least and the lost of God's flock who need us the most.

Then there are the others who appear to have new shoes or who have a cell phone on the backpack beside them, or whose signs don't look worn. These are the ones I struggle with giving to. Are they scamming me? Are they scamming God? But who am I to judge their situation? I have been reminded that whatever has brought them to this intersection to solicit donations from total strangers is infinitely more complicated than the struggles I deal with on a day-to-day basis. It simply isn't my place to judge them, only to help be God's hands and feet in our community.

These bags are, and will continue to be, a gratifying and humbling experience. And on behalf of all those who have been given and received them - **Thanks and keep 'em coming!**




