Fifth Sunday Offering for January – People Serving People in Minneapolis

Our 5th Sunday offering for January will go to support *People Serving People*, the largest and most comprehensive emergency shelter for families experiencing homelessness in Minnesota.

The 99 hotel-style emergency shelter housing units for children and families experiencing homelessness include a bathroom, beds, basic furniture, and a door families can lock behind them to feel safe. Three nutritious meals are served daily in the cafeteria (currently, due to covid-19, meals are delivered to each housing unit), and diapers and other basic necessities are provided free of charge. After immediate basic needs are met, families are provided access to the following comprehensive Engagement Services to move towards stability (among others):

- Early Childhood Development Program
- Family Activities such as movies, board games, bingo or other special events
- Financial Fitness Classes for adults to learn basic financial skills
- K-12 Programs including one-on-one tutoring, homework assistance, and enrichment activities.

Caring Corner

We're starting out 2022 with a month spent praying together: privately, as a family, and as a congregation. The theme for January will be "31 Days, 31 Ways, 2 Pray 4 Families," from author Catherine P. Downing. She writes from her strong base of Christian faith and a mother whose son has a chronic and serious mental illness.

Her introduction to this exercise explains it best:

"Families who walk alongside their loved ones in the labyrinths of mental illnesses are often hesitant to ask for prayer. They might feel others will judge them or their loved one, offer uninformed advice or initiate the gossip chain. But friends who observe or are aware of their journey don't necessarily need specific details to pray effectively."

Please join us in a daily prayer you will find on the Light of Christ Facebook posts, on our website or in a special personal email. There are printed copies of the entire month of prayers in the Narthex for you to take home, as you desire. This theme will also be featured in our Sunday services.

If you or someone you love lives through the ups and downs of mental illness, we pray for healing and peace that comes from nurturing and being rooted in our faith and trust in our God.

Catherine Downing wrote a blog on <u>sparksofredemptivegrace.com</u> called *Mental Illness, Prayer and Extravagant Grace* in which she shares her four personal prayer principles. We will highlight one each week of the month.

Week #3:

Because God invites us to ask, seek and knock (Matthew 7:7), I keep asking, seeking and knocking. I ask for direction on how to help our son. I seek after his healing and wholeness. I knock, expecting mercy to answer. As I pray I am mindful that I implore neither a stingy, grace-hoarding deity nor an impotent wannabe god. Instead I come as one welcomed into the throne room of the Most High God, at the invitation of his generous Spirit, through the door opened by his Son.

Prayer, I have experienced, is an invitation to worshipful confidence.

Also, because my own sins and limitations impede my life every bit as much as mental illness disrupts our son's, I pray for forgiveness and transformation. I see how our son is unaware of the ways mental illness clouds his judgment and blocks his opportunities, so I ask God to reveal my own blind spots.

Prayer, I have begun to understand, is a sacrifice of sincere humility.

The Holy Spirit—Then and Now – The Holy Spirit is probably the least understood person of the Holy Trinity. Yet the Holy Spirit is a vital, vibrant presence in our lives. So, how do we learn to be more aware, more awake, and more in tune to the presence of the Spirit within us and around us and between us? One way is to study the Book of Acts. The full title of Acts is *The Acts of the Apostles*, but it could also be titled *The Acts of the Holy Spirit*. In Acts, we see the Holy Spirit at work transforming lives, communities, and situations.

Pastor Bruce will be leading a four-week series on the Book of Acts. We will meet on **February 6**, **13**, **20**, **27** at **10:15** AM in the new Living Room (old Youth Room). We will be using the Bible Project

videos for the basis for our learning and discussion. No need to register. Just come with your Bible and a mind and heart that is open to the transforming presence of the Holy Spirit.

Wounded Healers

Thornton Wilder once wrote a play titled *The Angel That Troubled the Waters*. The play takes its inspiration from the story in John 5:1-10. In that story, an angel appears at the Pool of Siloam in the Temple complex in Jerusalem and stirs the waters. Surrounding the pool are people who are afflicted with all sorts of ailments because once the angel stirs the waters, whomever gets into the pool first is healed.

One of the people laying near the pool is a man who has been at the pool for thirty-eight years. He has never been first in the pool. In the biblical account, Jesus heals the man of his paralysis.

But in the play, the angel asks the man why he wants to be healed because it is his affliction that gives him his strength and allows him to help and heal others. Then the angel says: "In the service of love only wounded soldiers can serve."

In the service of God's love only wounded can serve. Because it is our wounds that heal the wounds of others. Wounds heal wounds. We see that in AA, in grief support groups, in wounded veterans' groups, in kids fighting cancer, and in many other situations.

Thus, we can all serve because we all are wounded in one way or another and we all carry scars. God did not cause the wounds. God doesn't afflict us with illnesses. But God does use our wounds to heal the wounds of others.

We are wounded healers. In this way, we are only following in the footsteps of our Lord. He is the Wounded Healer. The prophet Isaiah had this to say about the Messiah: "He was wounded for our transgressions. He was bruised for our iniquities. On him was the chastisement that made us whole. And by his wounds we are healed."

By his wounds we are healed—in body and mind and spirit. By his wounds we are healed—beginning here and now. By his wounds we are healed—finally and forever, in the life to come. So, turn to him. Give him your wounds and let him heal you, so that you, in turn, can be a wounded healer for others.
