Fifth Sunday Offering for January – People Serving People in Minneapolis

Our 5th Sunday offering for January will go to support *People Serving People*, the largest and most comprehensive emergency shelter for families experiencing homelessness in Minnesota.

The 99 hotel-style emergency shelter housing units for children and families experiencing homelessness include a bathroom, beds, basic furniture, and a door families can lock behind them to feel safe. Three nutritious meals are served daily in the cafeteria (currently, due to covid-19, meals are delivered to each housing unit), and diapers and other basic necessities are provided free of charge. After immediate basic needs are met, families are provided access to the following comprehensive Engagement Services to move towards stability (among others):

- Early Childhood Development Program
- Family Activities such as movies, board games, bingo or other special events
- Financial Fitness Classes for adults to learn basic financial skills
- K-12 Programs including one-on-one tutoring, homework assistance, and enrichment activities.



"Please pass a thank you along to your committee – the 31 days 31 ways is so helpful and inspiring – it comes at a perfect time and seems like a wonderful way to approach - helping people understand the enormity of these situations and the hopefulness of help and healing – a new normal to work with – I think we are lucky to have you right now right here."

"I just wanted to say, I'm really loving these daily prayers. It's such a great way to bring awareness to some of these mental health issues and also is very calming to read some of these that I can relate to. I think January is such a great month to do this as well, since winter can be so depressing!"

The author of 31 Days, Catherine P. Downing, has blogged on sparksofredemptivegrace.com, her four prayer principles that have helped her remain steadfast in her faith and hopeful in the face of her son's serious mental illness challenges with bipolar disease. She blogged: "In recent years my beliefs about prayer, tested on the battle-field of my son's mania and repaired in the infirmary of sweet stability, have settled into a courageous trust in the One whose love, power and goodness are unfathomable and unstoppable."

Week #4: "Finally, because God draws near to those who draw near to him, I am emboldened to express the reality of my wobbly faith ("I do believe, help my unbelief," as in Mark 9:24) and in doing so, I am able to rest in the truth that he alone is the giver and sustainer of life. Prayer places me close enough to God to "touch the hem of his garment" (Matthew 9:20-21), and there I find peace and hope."

"Prayer, I have found, is the journey into extravagant grace. Prayer, indeed, is the tether that ties us to the only One who is loving enough to listen compassionately, and the only One wise enough to answer rightly, the only One mighty enough to respond thoroughly and the only One kind enough to wait with us as his own goodness unfolds."

Adult Education in February

The Holy Spirit—Then and Now – The Holy Spirit is probably the least understood person of the Holy Trinity. Yet the Holy Spirit is a vital, vibrant presence in our lives. So, how do we learn to be more aware, more awake, and more in tune to the presence of the Spirit within us and around us and between us? One way is to study the Book of Acts. The full title of Acts is *The Acts of the Apostles*, but it could also be titled *The Acts of the Holy Spirit*. In Acts, we see the Holy Spirit at work transforming lives, communities, and situations.

Pastor Bruce will be leading a four-week series on the Book of Acts. We will meet on **February 6, 13, 20, 27 at 10:15** AM in the new Living Room (old Youth Room). We will be using the Bible Project

videos for the basis for our learning and discussion. No need to register. Just come with your Bible and a mind and heart that is open to the transforming presence of the Holy Spirit.






