Caring Corner

Your Healing and Wholeness Committee wishes you all God's blessings in the New Year!

We're starting out 2022 with a month spent praying together: privately, as a family, and as a congregation. The theme for January will be "31 Days, 31 Ways, 2 Pray 4 Families," from author Catherine P. Downing. She writes from her strong base of Christian faith and a mother whose son has a chronic and serious mental illness.

Her introduction to this exercise explains it best:

"Families who walk alongside their loved ones in the labyrinths of mental illnesses are often hesitant to ask for prayer. They might feel others will judge them or their loved one, offer uninformed advice or initiate the gossip chain. But friends who observe or are aware of their journey don't necessarily need specific details to pray effectively."

Please join us in a daily prayer you will find on the Light of Christ Facebook posts, in a daily email, or on our website. There are printed copies of the entire month of prayers in the Narthex for you to take home, as you desire. This theme will also be featured in our Sunday services.

If you or someone you love lives through the ups and downs of mental illness, we pray for healing and peace that comes from nurturing and being rooted in our faith and trust in our God.

Catherine Downing wrote a blog on sparksofredemptivegrace.com called **Mental Illness, Prayer and Extravagant Grace** in which she shares her four personal prayer principles. We will highlight one each week of the month.

WEEK #1:

- 1) First, because mental illnesses are brain disorders, I pray as I would for any other physical sickness.
- 2) Because God can and does heal bodies, I always pray for healing.
- 3) Because that healing often comes through medical and therapeutic means, I pray for doctors, counselors and chemists.
- 4) Because healing is enhanced by intentional body care, I pray for good rest, nutrition and exercise.
- 5) Because in his providence, God doesn't always cure everyone, I pray for patience, wisdom and enduring faith.
- 6) Prayer, I have learned is an act of open-handed expectation.

John 17:33: (Jesus) "I have told you all this so that you may have peace in me. Here on earth you will have many trials and sorrows. But take heart, because I have overcome the world." Amen!



Word for the Week from Pastor Bruce

The Work of Christmas

Howard Thurman was the dean of the chapel at Howard University and then at Boston University back in the middle part of the last century. He was also a poet, a theologian, a pastor, and teacher. He was one of the leading lights of the Civil Rights movement in the 1950s and 1960s and he also served a mentor to Martin Luther King, Jr.

He once wrote a poem titled *The Work of Christmas Begins*. It is one of my favorite Christmas poems.

When the song of the angels is stilled,
When the star in the sky is gone,
When the kings and princes are home,
When the shepherds are back with their flock,
The work of Christmas begins:

To find the lost,
To heal the broken,
To feed the hungry,
To release the prisoner,
To rebuild the nations,
To bring peace among brothers,
To make music in the heart.

Thurman draws an intimate connection between our Christmas celebration and our Christian service. We rightly celebrate the Incarnation and rejoice in the stories of the angels, the stars, the shepherds and the magi. But once our Christmas celebration is over it is then time to begin again doing the work of Christmas: to find the lost, the heal the broken, to feed the hungry and so on.

Our Christmas celebration is meant to fuel our Christian service. Our worship in the sanctuary is meant to strengthen our service in the world. We praise the Christ Child in the liturgy so that we may serve him in daily life, especially among the least of his sisters and brothers.

So, thank you! Thank you for doing the work of Christmas. Thank you for doing the work of Christmas this past year. Thank you for doing the work of Christmas throughout this pandemic. And I pray that the Holy Spirit will strengthen us in the year ahead so that we can continue doing the work of Christmas in the joy and the hope of the Christ Child.


