Silent Prayer and Meditation in the Sanctuary

Beginning September 23rd, the Light of Christ Sanctuary will be available for prayer and meditation every Wednesday from 4:30 to 6:30 PM and every Thursday from 11:30 AM to 1:30 PM beginning September 24th.

Light of Christ has not changed who we are or what we do but pandemic concerns have changed how we live out our vision as a welcoming, accepting and enjoyable place to gather. We continue to find ways to learn and grow together - to be a place where people can bring their joys, their questions, their fears. We continue to be a faith community that finds peace in prayer and meditation.

Each of us has our own way to be close to our Lord in prayer and meditation and for many of us that closeness to God is most felt in our Light of Christ Sanctuary. This fall we want to again provide an opportunity where we can come to the Sanctuary to have private time with our thoughts, our prayers and our personal time with God.

Everyone planning time in the Sanctuary will be asked to utilize a Signup Genius schedule to select dates you choose to use the Sanctuary for personal meditation. Attached to the Signup Genius schedule is a drawing that denotes available Sanctuary seating - please select an available pew seat for your use during time in the Sanctuary.

This time is meant for silent prayer for each person in the Sanctuary and social distancing is to be respected. Masks and COVID-19 compliance are required. Again, this is quiet time for thought, prayer and personal connection with God.

Patience in Times of Uncertainty

"But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience." (Romans 8:25)

As we enter another transition season with the weather, school restarting, and schedules in general, it is a great time to reflect on how patience and perspective can help guide our way. NEW SERVICE OPPORTUNITY

For the past several months Light of Christ has partnered with Our Father's Lutheran Church in Rockford to distribute fresh produce to area residents. This service was spearheaded by NourishingHOPE which is a group from Our Father's that was formed for the purpose of "creating connections in the community to feed the whole person: body, mind and spirit - seeking to ease food insecurity." In conjunction with Wright County Community Action (WCCA), NourishingHOPE is now expanding this ministry to include preparation and delivery of frozen meals to senior citizens in our area. Light of Christ has again been invited to partner in this new initiative.

We are now asking for a person or persons to organize Light of Christ's involvement as we formulate how best to engage in this expanded ministry.

Startup duties will primarily involve -

- Connecting with the chair of NourishingHOPE to learn in greater detail their vision and how best to incorporate that at Light of Christ
- Determine best ways to communicate this offering to persons in our congregation and community in need of the food deliveries and/or determine potential need in conjunction with other similar services available in this area
- Long range will likely include a need to recruit volunteers to potentially assist in making meals and persons willing to deliver the meals. (commercial freezers at Our Father's will be used to store frozen meals)

Hope. As a community of faith, our hope is in God's word, love and



faithfulness. Hope keeps us going through tough and challenging times. For people suffering with anxiety, depression or other mental illnesses, their hope can get lost. During September, Suicide Prevention Month, we continue to highlight facts and information to raise awareness. This year's theme is **BeThe1To**: ask, be there, keep them safe, help them stay connected, follow up. You may "be the one to" give a friend or loved one hope.

(From NAMI.com):

It's okay to talk about suicide:

- Suicide is the <u>2nd</u> leading cause of death among people aged 10-34 in the U.S.
- Suicide is the 10th leading cause of death in the U.S.
- The overall suicide rate in the U.S. has increased by 31% since 2001
- 46% of people who die by suicide had a diagnosed mental health condition
- <u>90%</u> of people who die by suicide had shown symptoms of a mental health condition, according to interviews with family, friends and medical professionals (*also known as psychological autopsy*)
- Lesbian, gay and bisexual youth are <u>4x</u> more likely to attempt suicide than straight youth
- 75% of people who die by suicide are male
- Transgender adults are <u>nearly 12x</u> more likely to attempt suicide than the general population
- Annual prevalence of serious thoughts of suicide, by U.S. demographic group:
 - \Rightarrow **4.3%** of all adults
 - \Rightarrow 11.0% of young adults aged 18-25
 - ⇒ 17.2% of high school students
 - ⇒ 47.7% of lesbian, gay, and bisexual high school students

STAYING CONNECTED

Upcoming Worship Plans!

We will hold one more outdoor service on October 4th. The service will be at 3:00 PM instead of 9:00 AM. As with the other outdoor services, we ask members to sign up beforehand and adhere to all previous COVID guidelines.

We are excited to announce that beginning October 11th we will hold one indoor worship service every Sunday! The service will start at **9:30 AM**. A Sign Up Genius will be sent to members. **Members must sign up in order to attend the indoor worship service.** There will be a seating chart attached to the Sign Up Genius and all members will choose seats ahead of time. The chart will be further explained in the Sign Up Genius. The indoor worship will not replace our online services. We will continue to post online worship services as well. As with the outdoor worship service, worship indoors will look a little different than previous indoor services:

- In order to comply with COVID-19 guidelines, we cannot accommodate more than 75 people. Make sure to sign up ASAP as all spots are first come, first serve!
- We ask all congregation members to please wear a mask. Children ages 3-5 are encouraged to wear masks, but it is not required. Children 2 years and younger are not required to wear masks.
- We ask congregation members to please refrain from singing along with the songs as this is a high-risk activity in group settings. Instead, feel free to hum along or just listen and enjoy!
- We will not participate in group prayer, since speaking together in a large group is also a high-risk activity.
- If you are experiencing COVID-like symptoms or have been exposed to a person diagnosed with COVID, please remain at home.

We are so excited to begin gathering again! Thank you in advance for your patience and cooperation as we navigate through all these guidelines. The safety of the whole Light of Christ family is and will always be of the utmost importance.


