Fifth Sunday Offering for October – Cancer Care Foundation MN

The Cancer Care Foundation MN began in 2019 as a sixth-grade service project for four Orono students (Ethan, Wes, Koen & Lucas) and one of the student's father (Dr. Michael Tulkki). They learned of a student from the University of MN football team who had battled osteosarcoma five times while continuing his pursuit as a collegiate athlete. In conversation with this athlete, they decided to produce a medical shirt for patients receiving cancer treatment. The design is meant to create an athletic shirt that is comfortable yet allows patients and medical professionals to easily access the port for delivery of medications.

After four years and 1,400+ shirts donated, the foundation continues to work to make the lives of young cancer patients a little easier. Last year they partnered with the University of MN Apparel Design Program to create a onesie for the smallest cancer patients and were awarded a grant to produce them. The boys also received the Outstanding Student Community Award given by the Randy Shaver Cancer Research and Community Fund in August of 2022.

Our congregation will be helping the Cancer Care Foundation MN by designating our special Fifth Sunday Offering to them this October.

Caring Corner

(from Rachel Boyack of the Healing & Wholeness Committee)



In the hustle and bustle of our daily lives, it's easy to overlook the profound impact we can have on one another, especially in our schools. Read on for some insights from the perspective of mental wellness and the Christian faith, with a particular focus on antibullying efforts, including Unity Day.

In our journey to support the mental wellness of our youth, it's important to recognize that faith and spirituality can play a significant role. The values of kindness, empathy, and love for one another are universal. These values align closely with the teachings of Jesus Christ, who advocated for compassion and inclusion.

Bullying is a serious problem that can have a devastating impact on mental health. Victims of bullying are more likely to experience anxiety, depression, low self-esteem, and even suicidal thoughts. As Christians, we are called to love our neighbors as ourselves, and this includes protecting them from harm. We can all play a role in preventing bullying by teaching our children about kindness and compassion, and by speaking up when we see it happening.

Here are some things we can do to help prevent bullying and promote mental wellness:

- Talk to our children about bullying and the importance of kindness and compassion.
- Teach our children how to stand up for themselves and others.
- Model positive behavior and teach our children how to resolve conflict peacefully.
- Be aware of the signs of bullying and intervene if we see it happening.
- Report bullying to church leaders or school officials.
- Celebrate Unity Day by wearing orange and talking about the importance of anti-bullying.

Unity Day, celebrated on the third Wednesday of October, is an excellent opportunity to strengthen anti-bullying efforts. This day is all about coming together, wearing orange to show unity against bullying, and sending a powerful message that no one should ever experience bullying. It's a chance for our youth to feel supported, safe, and included.

As we approach Unity Day, let us remember our commitment to nurturing mental wellness and promoting an environment of kindness and inclusion. Our Christian faith provides a strong foundation for these values, and with unity, we can create a community where every youth feels loved, valued, and protected from the harmful effects of bullying.

Greetings from the Delano Helping Hands Food Shelf!

First, we would like to extend a heartfelt thank you to the members of Light of Christ. Your generosity

throughout the years in both volunteer time and food has been a tremendous gift to our food shelf. In addition to donating food, LOC members support our Food Rescue program, provide volunteers three months out of the year for our Thursday shopping hours and monthly help to pack food for delivery within our community. We are a 100% volunteer run organization so we cannot stay open without the help of many in our community.

2023 has been a busy year for us thus far. Relative to 2022, many more families are in need of food support. Our food shelf usage has increased by 25% year over year – with over 60,000 pounds of food distributed. Thankfully, the continued generosity of our community has enabled us to meet this growing need. Starting this month, we are adding an additional shopping date on the second Saturday of the month (October 14). We plan to continue this additional date through the winter and perhaps into next summer. We are grateful for any donations given to us. Listed below are our current needs:

- Coffee and Tea
- BBQ sauce
- Mayonnaise
- Ready to eat soup (we get lots of chicken noodle and tomato)
- Tomato products (diced, sauce, paste, stewed)
- Canned fruits and vegetables
- Canned and boxed meals
- Canned mushrooms/olives/pickles
- Napkins and facial tissues
- Menstrual products
