This is week #2 of 31 Days 2 Pray 4 Families with Mental Illness- Catherine P. Downing is the author of this prayer calendar and this is her second principal she focuses on in her prayers for her son and their family as they meet challenges with his mental illness:

"Because each day has enough trouble of its own (Matthew 6:34b), I pray every single day for God's favor and grace. Every morning I thank God in anticipation of his presence being with us every single moment--no matter how the day unfolds. At the close of the day, I give thanks for the ways I have seen his goodness and mercy follow us on that particular day (Psalm 23:6). And of course, throughout the day are the ongoing conversations with our Father in heaven who knows our son best and loves him most. Prayer, I have discovered, is a discipline of unceasing watchfulness."

#### Good News from NAMI National's Government Relations, Policy & Advocacy team

For the first time in decades, the President included mental health as part of the State of the Union Address and launched a unity agenda focused on four key areas, one of which was mental health. Congressional committees focused on bipartisan efforts to address our nation's mental health crisis.

Here are a few highlights from 2022:

- After years of advocacy and planning, 988 became available nationwide. Demand for the 988 Lifeline has increased • more than 40 percent over 2021, representing hundreds of thousands more people who have accessed help and support during a mental health or suicide crisis. Just last week, funding increased from \$24 million in 2021 to more than \$500 million in 2023.
- \$1 billion to help schools hire and retain school mental health professionals and build a pipeline of future professionals over the next five years, which was passed in the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act this summer.
- \$1.01 billion for the Mental Health Block Grant program, a \$153 million increase and the first time the block grant has surpassed \$1 billion. The program allows states to fill gaps in needed mental health services.
- Congress just passed a bill last week which included extending telehealth flexibility for two years to allow many people to continue to access mental health care remotely, expanding the mental health workforce in Medicare and improving care for justice-involved youth re-entering the community, among many other provisions.

These are positive notes which will carry into the New Year!

## January Fifth Sunday Offering

Our January Fifth Sunday offering will be sent to Agate Housing & Services in Minneapolis. This was previously St. Stephen's prior to consolidating in 2021 with House of Charter also in Minneapolis. Both organizations began in the 1950s-1960s. Their goal is to support individuals and families experiencing homelessness in achieving permanent, affordable housing as well as many other services including ending hunger with the help of free public meals, free showers, employment outreach and assisting in obtaining birth certificates/ID supports if needed. Their goals are to help people live with more hope ahead. In 2021 alone this organization served 70,465 meals, provided 50,000 nights of



service, 462 emergency shelters, provided street outreach to 3600 people and provided 676 birth certificates. They also assist with mental health and addiction recovery, veteran support and many other support services. WE CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE!! We are also collecting much needed items for them in January including men's winter coats (large or X large), all sizes of gloves, hand warmers and twin- and full-size nousing + services bed sheets.
