



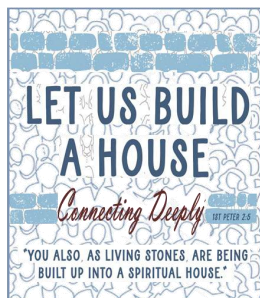

Starting **Sundays from January 11th to February 22nd** we are looking for members who want to host a brunch/lunch/or dinner to get to know the Wheatleys.

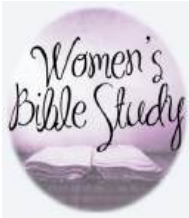

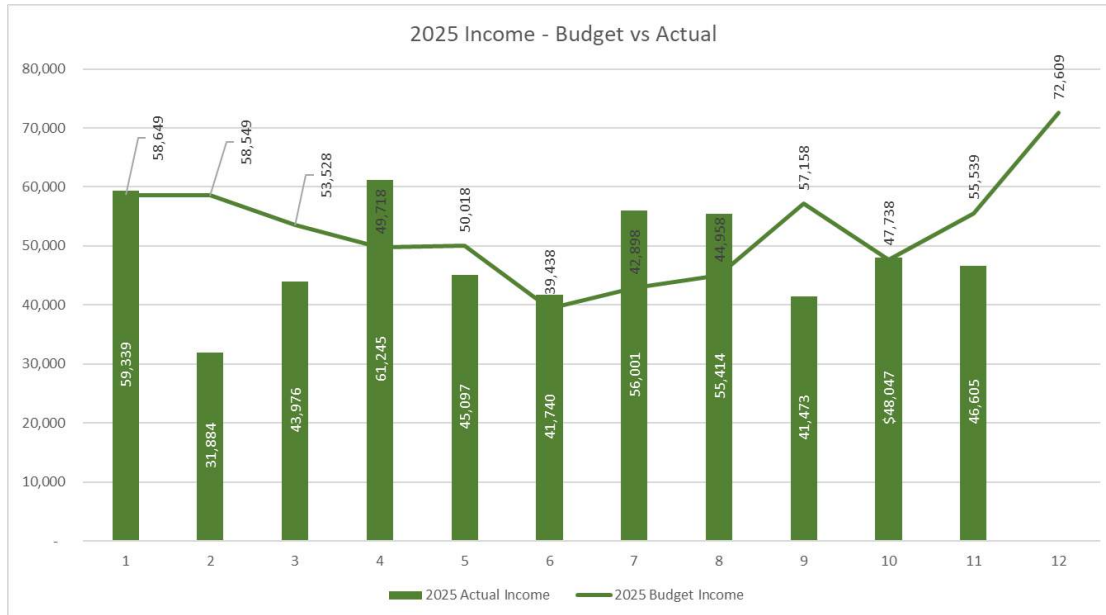


Support Our Youth!

Merry Christmas!

If you read my last article you heard all about *Rocking Around the Christmas Tree*. I thought I would make it a theme and bring up yet another Christmas song, *The 12 Days of Christmas*. It is a favorite song because it is repetitive and would distract kids for a long time when driving to Grandma's for Christmas. But did you ever stop and wonder why there were so many days of presents being given? I know as a youth I wondered why I didn't have a true love who would keep giving me more extravagant things (and then when I was a little older, I hoped my girlfriend, now wife, didn't expect the same). For many of us think of Christmas as just as December 25th, maybe we throw in December 24th in the evening, but in the church Calendar that is not nearly enough celebration. After all, we have just like the song says 12 days of Christmas. The first day of Christmas is December 25th and the Christmastide (the season of Christmas) was one of great celebration which lasted until January 5th (Epiphany eve). Not only was there feasting for these 12 days. But it was a time when many different celebrations would take place, including Boxing Day (a day to give to the poor), the Feast of St. John, New Year's Eve, New Year's Day, and many more.
