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Call Committee Update

We have completed our first big step as the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) was successfully submitted to the Synod. We received very positive feedback from Bishop Ann and want to extend a huge THANK YOU to all those who participated in putting that together or provided input during the congregational meetings. Now that the MSP is live, we will start to receive candidate names through one of three ways: candidates applying to the open position, the Synod reaching out to candidates who the Synod thinks would be a good fit, and nominations from the LOC congregation. If you wish to nominate a potential candidate to the call committee, please fill out the Nomination Form found <u>HERE</u> on our website. Nomination forms will also be available in the Narthex of the church through January 7th and can be submitted electronically or placed in the offering plate during service.

Next steps in the call process are reviewing potential candidates' resumes and conducting interviews starting in mid to late January.

The Call Committee will continue to provide updates to the congregation on a monthly basis or as appropriate.

Nurturing Mental Wellness in Youth During the Holiday Season: A Christian Perspective

The holiday season is often a time of joy, connection, and celebration. However, for some youth, this period can also bring about feelings of stress, anxiety, or even isolation. As Christians, we are called to be a light to the world, and this includes supporting the mental wellness of our youth, especially during the holiday season.

Understanding the Challenges

4. Promote self-care practices: Encourage youth to engage in activities that promote relaxation and stress reduction, such as mindfulness exercises or journaling.

5. Create a holiday gratitude list: Help youth focus on the blessings in their lives, fostering a sense of appreciation and contentment.
