

Caring Corner

(from Sue Fink of the Healing & Wholeness Committee)

July is Disability Pride Month, a month dedicated to promoting awareness, acceptance, and empowerment of people with disabilities.



This month, the Minnesota Council on Disability highlights the unique experiences and perspectives of people within our community. We also take this opportunity to recognize the attitudes and barriers that continue to limit our full participation in society.

Excerpts from a guest blog post by Lance Hegland, citizen advocate:

"Throughout history, we've learned that disability can happen for different reasons, like genetics, accidents, illnesses, or simply getting older. Disability is just a part of being human. When I say "disability," I'm talking about unique circumstances, not something that's good or bad. It's like different shades of blue, such as turquoise, teal, and indigo. Each shade has its own strengths and weaknesses, benefits and drawbacks.

Sadly, some people only see disability as bad or undesirable. They might think people with disabilities are weak, helpless, or dependent on others. That's not true. And it's hurtful.

Such prejudice about disability can cause people to overlook the advantages, strengths, and benefits of disability. They likely don't know about all the valuable things that we offer our families, friends, and communities. This lack of understanding often leads to discrimination: treating us differently than those who don't seem to have a disability.

When we face discrimination and exclusion, we have fewer opportunities to contribute to and benefit from humanity and society. This makes our lives even more challenging.

But here's the truth: everyone and everything has challenges, weaknesses, and drawbacks. However, the advantages, strengths, and benefits can outweigh these challenges if we practice compassion, wisdom, and persistence.

We are just as human as anyone else. Because of our unique challenges, we often need to find creative solutions. So, we are often inventive. We help remind society about how adaptable and determined human beings are, even when facing big hurdles. Many of the technologies people use every day were created by people with disabilities to address their own challenges, such as automatic doors and voice dictation. Plus, our diversity gives us all opportunities to practice empathy, understanding, and creativity for each other while recognizing our interdependence.

To experience the goodness and benefit of disability, we all need to work on consciously overcoming our natural tendency to focus on negatives. We must practice compassion, wisdom, and persistence for ourselves and others. By identifying the gifts that we offer, we can build and celebrate the pride that we have for ourselves. By getting to know the gifts of others throughout our community, we can celebrate our individual and community pride together; all for one, one for all; diversified unity, unified diversity. Then, we can better support each other in staying healthy, safe, respected, and included. We can experience the incredible strength and beauty of humanity working together."

Light of Christ member, Al Bunker, has faced her own challenges with disabilities and had these wise words to share:

"First, we need to disable the 'R' word. 'Retarded' has no place in how we see or treat others. Actually, a low percentage of people with disabilities have slowed mental development. Using the "R" word is extremely hurtful and unkind. When a person called me that, I went home and cried. I look normal until I speak, use my tremoring hands, or walk. My mind is normal. Don't make assumptions based on how a person looks or acts."

"If you come upon a person with a visible disability, don't assume they need help, since it may just take them more time and they can ask if they need your help."

"Having a disability is hard, but LIFE is hard! We ALL have struggles we face. I just want the world to be kind and inclusive of all human beings. Like Jesus!"

"I encourage you to participate in https://www.bestbuddies.org/minnesota/. Best Buddies is an organization that pairs an able-bodied person with one who is disabled for outings and activities. Or, support Special Olympics as an able-bodied partner and have some fun!"

We are **all** God's children. Let's remember that.


Last Chance for Valleyfair!

- \Rightarrow When: Tuesday, July 23rd
- ⇒ Time: 9:30 AM 6:00 PM (at the park from approximately 10 AM 5:30 PM). New as of last year: youth 15 and under must be accompanied by an adult after 4 pm, so depending on our ages and numbers (of youth and adults), we will adjust plans as needed.
- ⇒ Who: Light of Christ youth and friends (completed grades 7-12 and grads. ;)



- ⇒ Cost: \$40 (check or online). This includes \$36 for the group ticket and some money to cover transportation. Transportation will depend on our numbers, adults attending, etc.
- ⇒ **Bring**: Sunscreen, spending money *(optional)* or a cold lunch (we will provide a cooler with ice packs), swimming stuff if you plan to go in the waterpark.
- ⇒ Note: Youth will spend the day in the park in groups of 2 or more. We cannot guarantee that each group will have an adult with them but we will have a check-in time (when we eat lunch) and have a contact number for at least one youth in each group.
